



*A Glimpse into the
64 Incarnations of Paramaśiva
The SPH Nithyananda Paramashivam*



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The various forms that were given by Paramaśiva to the Gods and devotees :

1. Linga Murthi – In this form, the God Shiva is worshipped in formless form.
2. Lingodbhava Murthi – This is the form of Paramaśiva emerging from Formlessness.
3. Mukhalingam – In this form the Shiva Linga with five faces of Paramaśiva is worshipped.
4. Sadashiva Murthi – Paramaśiva with 5 faces.
5. Mahasadashiva Murthi – Paramaśiva with twenty five faces.
6. Umamaheshvara Murthi – This is the sixth form where Paramaśiva is with Devi Uma.
7. Sukhasana Murthi – In this particular form you will find Lord Shiva with his consort and is in a pleasant mood. If worshiped in this form, he grants peace and happiness.
8. Umesha Murthi – in this form Paramaśiva is seen with His consort and one of his hands is in a vardhana pose.
9. Somaskandha Murthi- This is a popular form of Lord Shiva. Lord Shiva is seen with Goddess Uma and Lord Skanda in this form.
10. Vrishabhantika Murthi- In this pose Lord Shiva is seen along with the bull. Many devotees prefer to worship the Lord in this form.
11. Chandrashekhara Murthi- Paramaśiva with crescent moon is seen in this form. This was when the moon told him to keep him on his head after being saved from the curse of his father in law by Lord Shiva.
12. Bhujanga Lalita Murthi – In this form, He is seen with a snake.
13. Sada Nritta Murthi – In this form Paramaśiva is seen in the form of Nataraja. He is seen with his consort, standing on asura.
14. Gangavisarjana Murthi – Paramaśiva is releasing Ganga from his jatas in this form.
15. Ardhanarishvara Murthi – Paramaśiva and Goddess Shakti, his consort, are seen together in one form. The form is half Lord Shiva and half Goddess Parvati.
16. Vrishabha Rudrar – in this form Lord Shiva is seen sitting on a bull.
17. Bhujanga Trasa Murthi – In this particular form Lord Shiva is seen with a snake in one hand and fire in the other. There is damaru in one hand and with the fourth hand, he is seen blessing the devotees.
18. Chanda Tandava Murthi – In this form, Lord Shiva is seen standing on asura. It is considered to be one of the fierce forms of Lord Shiva.
19. Tripurantaka Murthi – In this form, Lord Shiva is seen riding a chariot that is driven by four horses. He is with Devi in this form.



20. Gajasura Samhara Murthi – In this form, Paramaśiva is seen peeling an elephant.
21. Sandhya Nritta Murthi – In this form Lord Shiva is seen with his consort and with a damaru in his hand. He is seen killing an asura in this form.
22. Gangadhara Murthi – Paramshiva with the river Ganga falling into matted locks is seen in this particular form.
23. Kalyanasundara Murthi – Lord Shiva in this form is seen getting married to Goddess Parvati the daughter of Himalaya.
24. JvarabhagnaMurthi – This form of the Lord Shiva is also called the Jvarahara Murthi. In this form the Lord is seen with three faces and three legs. The Lord is dancing in this pose.
25. Shardhula Hara Murthi – This is a form in which Paramaśiva is seen with a tiger skin.
26. Keshavartha Murthi – This form of the Lord Shiva is also called the Shankaranarayana. In this form the Lord Shiva and Lord Vishnu are seen together in one body. You can see damaru in one hand and Chakra in the other.
27. Chandisha Anugraha Murthi – In this form, Lord Shiva is seen gifting the Kamdhenu cow to a Sage. Kamdhenu is a mystical cow which fulfills all the wishes of its master.
28. Veenadhara DakshinaMurthi – In this form Lord Shiva is seen holding a musical instrument that is called the Veena. He is seen standing on a demon and is surrounded by Gods.
29. Lakulishvara Murthi – Lord Shiva is seen sitting in a composed form holding his damaru and Trishul.
30. Vaduka Murthi – This form of Lord Shiva is called Bhairava. In this particular form the Lord is seen holding a snake and a bowl. In this form the Lord is seen as a simple hermit that he was.
31. Aghorastra Murthi – Lord Shiva is seen as an aghori in this form.
32. Guru Murthi – In this form Lord Shiva is seen as a sage who is teaching others. This was the form in which the Lord used to share his knowledge with the sages in the Gyan sabha.
33. Jalandharavata Murthi – In this particular form you can see Lord Shiva killing Jalandhara. Jalandhara was a part of Lord Shiva but as he was creating havoc in heaven and earth, the Lord Shiva was forced to kill him.
34. Ekapadha Murthi – This is a form of Lord Shiva where he is seen standing on one leg.
35. Gouwrileela Samanvita Murthi – Lord Shiva is seen sitting with his consort in this pose.
36. Brahma Shirachetha Murthi – Once Lord Vishnu and Brahma had a fight and they wanted to know who was greater. Lord Shiva in this form is seen cursing Lord Brahma saying that he will never be worshiped in spite of being the creator of the world.



37. Varaha Samhara Murthi – Lord Shiva is seen killing Varaha in this form.
38. Shishyabhava Murthi- The Lord Shiva is seen in this form with his devotees and his consort Goddess parvati.
39. Pasupatha Murthi – This is a form of Lord Shiva he is seen with some devatas and he is in a larger-than-life form.
40. Bhikshatana Murthi – This is a form of Paramaśiva on alms.
41. Vyakyana DakshinaMurthi – In this form again the Lord is seen killing an asura who would not allow the sages to do their duties.
42. Kalanthakar – In this form Lord Shiva is also called the Kalasamhara Murthi. In this the Lord came out of a fire to kill a demon.
43. Bhairava Murthi – In this form Lord Shiva is seen with a dog.
44. Kshetrapaala Murthi – In this form, the Lord is also called the Bhairavar. He is again seen with a dog in this form.
45. Dakshayagyahara Murthi – In this form the Lord is seen killing the king Daksha during the Daksha yagna where Lord Shiva was insulted and his wife Sati killed herself.
46. Ashvaruda Murthi – The Lord Shiva is seen sitting on a horse in this pose.
47. Ekapada Trimurthi – This is a very strong form of Lord Shiva. In this form he is seen taking the forms of vishnu and brahma
48. Gowri Varaprada Murthi – In this form the Lord is seen with gauri.
49. Vishapaharana Murthi – The Lord Shiva is seen resting in this pose with his consort sitting beside him.
50. Kurma samhara Murthi – The Lord Shiva is seen with Lord Vishnu in this form.
51. Prarthana Murthi – This is a form in which Lord Shiva is seen with his consort in a very happy mood.
52. Kankala Murthi – Lord Shiva is seen in a standing pose all alone in this form.
53. Simhaghna Murthi – In this form the Lord is seen with three heads of a lion and he is seen killing a demon.
54. Yoga dakshina Murthi – This is a pose in which Lord Shiva is seen in yogic posture. The Lord in this form is also called dakshinaMurthi.
55. Kama dahana Murthi – In this form Lord Shiva is seen burning down Lord Kama.
56. Apatuttarana Murthi – The Lord is seen as a simple hermit in this form with a stick and a bowl.



57. Veerabhadra Murthi – The Lord Shiva is seen as a warrior in this form loaded with weapons.
58. Kiratha Murthi- The Lord Shiva is seen with bow and arrow in this form. He looks like a hunter in this form.
59. Gajantika Murthi – The Lord in this form is seen with an elephant.
60. Tripada Trimurthi – In this form again Lord Shiva is seen standing on one leg with lord Vishnu and Brahma on both his sides.
61. Chakradanasvarupa Murthi- In this particular form, Paramaśiva is seen giving Sudarshana chakra to Lord Vishnu.
62. Garudanthika Murthi – Lord Shiva is seen in this form with his consort and he is being worshiped by a number of Gods including Garuda.
63. Matsya samhara Murthi – In this form Lord Shiva is seen with a fish. It was a form he took when Lord Vishnu took the form of fish.
64. Raktabhiksha pradana Murthi – Lord Shiva is seen with Lord Vishnu in this form. Lord Shiva is seen using his Trishula to get some blood from the body of Lord Vishnu.



Paramaśiva's superconscious mutation manifestations, when He superconsciously mutated His manifestations, 64 manifestations documented in Veda Āgamas, which He himself describes, manifesting all of them in you is the complete manifestation of Paramādvaita.
